Meet the Juror

Barbra Riley | Juror Statement

First, thank you to Joanna Pitman at the Art Center for inviting me to juror this selection of exciting entries and to Soleil Day for organizing these entries to the Photo Biennial 2024.

I love looking at photographs. Aside from being a photographer and teaching photography for many decades, I just love looking at photographs. I have always encouraged my students to enter juried shows because it's good for getting feedback on your photographs and beneficial to see other photographers' work. More importantly, they can begin a list of exhibitions for their resume.

OK, what you are waiting for... How do I determine awards? Mystery, magic and seeing things I haven't seen before figure prominently in my choices.



Because of my background, I look for aesthetic quality, interesting content, technical competence, and finally, presentation.

As I looked at each photograph multiple times, I would find myself stopping and spending time with certain images. I guess it's because I wanted to know more about them. Images that I kept coming back to are photographs that surprise me, either in composition and/or in subject matter.

As I'm drawn to a specific image, I naturally bring my own context (story) to the photographer's story. When looking at a photograph, because of knowledge, experiences, and persona, each person sees a different story than anyone else.

Therefore, it's not realistic to believe that jurying a show is completely objective. There is always personality involved. I always say that whatever the juror ate for breakfast that day could determine whether a work is given an award. I have personally received acceptance and rejection from two different shows ... on the same day... for the same photograph!

To the photographers, in the words of Imogene Cunningham: "Which of my photographs is my favorite? The one I'm going to take tomorrow." And for everyone, enjoy the show and bring YOUR context to the viewing of this exciting exhibition.
